2020 Tour Financial Information

Following the end of each season we publish a financial statement (our ledger) that shows the Tour's sources and uses of funds. You can find our 2020 season ledger at the bottom of our <u>Financial Declaration page</u>.



A brief summary is that the Tour started the 2020 season with a balance of \$868 and ended the season with \$1042 so we are in good shape. The only expenses we had were the Top 10 award plaques, shipping for 3 of them, and a \$100 donation to GliderScore.

In Memoriam - Fred Weaver

USA F5J has lost a great friend and pilot **Fred Weaver**. Fred passed away Saturday night (Jan 9) after battling a long illness. He has many many friends in the U.S. who are mourning his passing. Fred lived in rural northern California east of Sacramento and absolutely loved competing in F5J. I have many fond memories of F5J practice sessions and contests with Fred as part of our "NorCal F5J" group. Among his many admirable traits Fred had a great sense of humor that sometimes involved politics. He would often send hilarious emails that would brighten my day.



Fred was heavy into soaring competition back in the heyday of thermal duration (TD) contesting. He had especially fond memories of the "North/South" TD competition that pitted Northern Calif against Southern Calif. In 2019 Fred shared this pic that he said was from around 1982 at the "North/South Bowl."

So it was Fred's idea to try and rekindle the camaraderie and feeling of that, but this time with F5J. Thus was born Fred's *North/South F5J Challenge*. All through the summer of 2019 Fred mapped out what he wanted with his new team-oriented event. And Fred was really excited to hear that CVRC would let us host it in Visalia. Game on!

N/S #1 signups were good and the teams were even: 10 North and 10 South. As the contest progressed it was clear South was going to be tough to beat. After 8 rounds they were up by 300 pts, after 12 rounds they were up by 408 points. Then it was time for the last (13th) round. Here's **Bob McGowan** describing what happened:

What happened in that last round was the North's Fred Weaver flew out the full 10 minute slot while everyone else in the group landed at around 2 minutes. Wind was next to nothing and conditions had been excellent for the prior group. Everyone in the group launched low thinking they had a good read. Fred cut off at 30 meters, Ali at 33, and others just slightly above. When it wasn't working, Fred pushed out further and eventually hooked up but it was too late for anyone else to follow. This one dramatic flight group win by Fred catapulted the North forward by hundreds of points because Ali and Brad, key South front runners in this group, already had bad throw-outs. We, the North, were impossibly behind and it was only Fred's final round save that put us on top so it was decided that Fred would be the first holder of perpetual North/South Cup.

So Fred's gutsy miracle gave the first N/S F5J Challenge cup to the North, surprising everyone there. Here is a video starting as Fred conducts the team awards part. You can tell he was having fun.

2021 Team Selects - An Update

As a result of "virus rescheduling" the next FAI F5J world championships (WC) had been rescheduled to Bulgaria in 2022. That would have put the next USA Team Selects (TS) contest in this year (2021). However, with the ongoing uncertainty of international travel this may not happen. Here is a Jan 6 2021 update from FAI-F5 TS Committee member **Steve Neu**:

"Based on some recent discussion regarding FAI class 1 events on the schedule for 2021 by members of the F5 SC I would say there is considerable doubt that the current schedule will be possible based on the fact that international air travel is still not easily possible now and may not be for many more months. What that means is that events on the schedule for 2021 may not happen which will require the FAI to reshuffle the schedules again which likely would affect the 2022 schedules.

What this means is that planning can go on for a TS but expect the WC timing to change from 2022 to 2023. "

2021 F5J Tour Rules Changes

Every year the Tour's Advisory Group (AG) discusses the FAI and Tour contest rules with the goal of improving and/or clarifying rules based on prior season experiences and feedback. This year we have added a Tour rule to clarify



landing tape positioning, as follows:

3. Tour Rules. 3A. Landing Tape Positioning – The tape must be stretched out straight and flat against the ground. The tape may be pulled in any direction but must always be straight. No tape loops or folds are allowed. Penalty for violating this rule is a zero landing. Note that the intent of this rule is to prohibit placement of the tape such that it could be used to arrest a sliding plane. The CD has discretion in determining what is acceptable.

While not an official FAI rule, previous F5J and F3J WC events have implemented a similar but more rigorous control of the landing tapes (when tapes are used). These include requiring the tape to be placed downwind and straight and not allowing competitors to touch the tape. One of the purposes of those local rules was to prevent using the tape to arrest landings. Some WC events have chosen to not use tapes at all and to use a measuring device (tape measure) that is placed on the ground after the landing. For the F5J USA Tour the AG did not want to take it to this extreme but wanted to follow the general principle of not allowing arrested landings.

Also FYI, after discussing F5J landing tape positioning with representatives of several European countries we learned that for the last decade it is widely accepted that landing tapes have to be straightened before landings.

Tour's rule change process

If you are curious about the Tour's rules change process, the Advisory Group is solely responsible for selection and implementation of the Tour's rules. Changes to the rules are discussed and voted on by the AG. Some rules changes are considered (in the AG's opinion) to be significant enough to warrant input from the community but not all changes fall into this category.
