World Championship event: August 12-16, 2019 in Trnava, Slovakia

The 1st F5J World Championship countdown clock is at 112 days! It seems like the days are running by fast. Team polo shirts will be ordered soon so here is a "sneak peek." This is the last call for corporate and club sponsorships, the ink will be on the fabric soon.



The organizers just released bulletin #2 which is mostly a request for more specific information regarding the pilots and the equipment they will use in competition. Spot checks for altimeter tampering are anticipated, and pilots will have the option of having their AMRT (altimeter/motor run timer) pre-tested prior to competition.

Each national team will be allocated a position on the field with electricity and one 4.5 meter square tent (with room for a second).



I'm really pleased to see that the fundraising meter has made it to the halfway mark. The team fund reimbursement policy covers expenses for the junior team members first so they should be all set. However, we still need donations to help out the senior pilots. **Thomas Cooke** of **MKS Servos USA** has sweetened the raffle prize pool with servos for the Vixen 2 from **Soaring USA** as well as five additional servo pairs for prizes. I encourage you all not to wait for a raffle ticket 'sale' because there won't be one.

Contest season is well underway and I hope you all will continue to provide support and encouragement to the team members when you see them on the field.

2020 FAI rule changes in 2019 Tour events

The FAI F5 sub-committee met on April 5-6 in Lausanne Switzerland and made their final determinations regarding F5J rule changes for 2020. You can read the rule proposal details and the voting results in this <u>RC Groups</u> <u>post</u> by Steve Neu. The F5J USA Tour Advisory Group has discussed the results and has agreed to implement the following rule changes in the



current 2019 season. **These changes are effective immediately as listed below** and are reflected in an update to the Tour <u>Contest Rules page</u>. If you have questions please post them in the <u>Tour RC Groups thread</u>.

Note: FAI rules paragraph sections are listed below (FAI proposal numbers in parenthesis).

5.5.11.1.1, 5.5.11.1.3 (proposals h,i,j) - The use of stability systems, gyros, or airborne sensors that could be used to actuate control surfaces are prohibited. A Tour deviation has been added to allow altimeter hardware but disallow its use in contests.

5.5.11.1.3 (proposal k) - Continue to allow emergency motor restarts via the existing F5J USA Tour rule deviation.

5.5.11.3.1 (proposal I) - Launches must now be made within the Safety Corridor and within 2 meters of the marked launch spot (i.e. usually the lane marker flag).

5.5.11.6 (proposal n) - Re-flights are allowed due to a timekeeper failure if the pilot informs the timekeeper of his model's position in a "reasonable time" before landing. Re-flights due to timekeeper failures/errors were always allowed; this rule change now clarifies the conditions under which such a re-flight can be claimed.

5.5.11.10 (proposal p) - Launches must be straight forward for 3 seconds before turning. Note this has been a CD guideline in F5J USA Tour contests for 2018 and 2019. CDs are encouraged to add a "beep" in their audio timing tracks to mark this 3 second "okay to turn" point.

5.5.11.10 (proposals q, r) - Launching- The motor must not be run during the last 60 seconds of prep time. A 100 point penalty is given if violated. The model must be launched in the Safety Corridor within 2 meters of the lane marker; a zero flight is given if this is violated.

5.5.11.11 (proposal t) - Landings approach direction can now be chosen by pilots on each flight, or, at the discretion of the CD, the landing direction may still be declared by the CD.

5.5.11.15 (proposal x) - Wind - The maximum FAI wind limit for F5J is now 9 m/sec (20 mph) measured at the landing spots at 2m above ground sustained for 1 min. The start of a contest is to be delayed if wind speed exceeds 12m/sec (26.8 mph) as measured 3 times for a sustained reading of 20 seconds during a 5 minute period.
