FAI Rule-making update

As some of you may know the F5J USA Tour's Advisory Group has been participating in an international working group that will be forwarding recommendations to the FAI shortly. These recommendations will be used as input into the FAI F5J rule-making process in April.

The current topic under discussion is that of clarifying what ancillary hardware should be allowed to be installed in F5J planes--even if their use in FAI contests is prohibited. The Advisory Group will not be making any official announcement to Tour pilots about rule changes until after the April rule-making work is completed. However we are offering the following clarifying statement to be used until further notice:

"Planes that fly in F5J USA Tour events do not have any restriction with regard to installing ancillary hardware such as altimeters, gyros (stabilization devices), and GPS. The use of altimeters and GPS in Tour contests is strictly prohibited but the use of stabilization devices is legal based on our current interpretation of FAI rules."

We do expect clarity on this issue when the next FAI F5J ruleset is released. Thanks.
