World Championship event: August 12-16, 2019 in Trnava, Slovakia

I'm also pleased to announce that three clubs have already expressed their support of the team with **Club Sponsorship** donations. Thanks go to **CVRC** (California), **EVEF** (Arizona) and **DESS** (North Carolina). Who will be next? The unfinished GliderScore compatible LED display prize was on display at *Southwest Classic F5J* contest and should be complete in time to be on display at the *East Coast Spring F5J Festival* in North Carolina.

The team's fund-raising meter currently stands at 45% thanks in part to the \$8000 contribution from the AMA. The team earned this contribution based solely on the number of competitors at the team select competition held in Denver last year. We don't yet know where or when the 2021 team selects will be held, but it's not too early to think about having your club prepare a bid. FAI F5J Rule-making Update

As reported last month the F5J USA Tour's Advisory Group has been participating in a 17 country working group that discussed and voted on proposed F5J rule changes. That work was officially concluded on March 13. The goal of this effort has been to forward recommendations to the FAI F5 sub-committee for consideration at the F5 Electric meeting on April 5-6 in Lausanne Switzerland.



Two members of our Advisory Group have been especially active in this process: **Steve Neu** and **Jim Monaco**. Steve Neu is a member of the F5 Electric sub-committee which encompasses F5J. Steve will be traveling soon to participate as one of 16 representatives in the FAI F5 meeting in Switzerland. Their work and voting will result in rule changes that affect FAI F5J rules starting in 2020. Jim Monaco has been the USA Tour's rules expert and has taken a "deep dive" and led discussions on some of the more controversial F5J rules. Jim's rules discussions have taken place both on RC Groups and as a part of the 17 country working group.

Working Group results - The F5J USA Tour Advisory Group discussed each of the working group proposals and established a position that we felt would best represent USA pilots. We're happy to report that our positions tracked the working group votes for a majority of proposals. However, as you might suspect we did not "get our way" with every proposal. A couple of the items that did not go our way:

- Gyros and altimeter hardware This proposal prohibited installation of any
 hardware in a plane other than the AMRT (limiter). The USA argued from the
 position that altimeter hardware should be allowed for practice flights but
 disabled during contests. This proposal passed with 15 yes, 1 no (USA), and 1
 abstaining. If this rule goes into effect the F5J USA Tour will likely institute a new
 rules deviation to allow altimeter hardware while disallowing its use in contests.
- Emergency motor restarts This proposal for allowing restarts failed by a vote of 6 yes, 10 no, and 1 abstaining. This means that the F5J USA Tour will probably continue with this as an FAI rules deviation.

In the end we feel fortunate to have been invited to participate in this international working group process. As soon as we hear how the sub-committee votes went we will let you all know.
